Course Title: WASTE MANAGEMENT TRAINING

Course Duration: Two Days (9.00 am - 4.00 pm)

Course Description:

This course gives an understanding of the principal legal obligations associated with the management of controlled and special waste, together with practical tools for the classification of waste type.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Discuss the principal legislation governing waste management
- 2. Provide the methodology for waste identification, segregation, classification and disposal
- 3. Describe the roles and responsibilities of all parties involved in the waste management chain
- 4. Discuss the opportunities for waste minimization

Course Content:

Identify key sources, typical quantities generated, composition, and properties
of waste

- 2. Waste collection options, the role of material recovery, re-use and cycling facilities.
- 3. Identify waste disposal or transformation techniques (landfills and incinerators)
- Recognize the relevant regulations that apply for facilities used for disposal, and destruction of waste
